TUNING INTO KIDS

It's been a very busy start to the year and being such a short term the Tuning Into Kids Program will not run this term. Paul has kept the list of names of people who are interested and will make contact about providing this on a Thursday night in term 2.

BRIDGES TRAINING

Bridges is a Literacy Program that is undertaken at NEPS usually with Grade 1 and 2 students to assist them with their reading and writing.

It is a very valuable and effective program where or helpers work with one student over the course of 30 lessons. Ideally, the student is seen 3 times a week by the same helper, thereby developing a stable and rewarding environment.

If you can spare 30-40 minutes, 3 times a week to assist a student chosen by their teacher, we would be extremely grateful. Training for volunteers will be run early in Term 2 over 2 days, 1 hour each day but dates are yet to be decided.

In addition to helping the student, volunteering as a Literacy assistant can be registered on your c.v and support an application for work.
