# **WALK SAFELY TO SCHOOL DAY**

Last Friday we held the Walk Safely To School Day. It was great to see so many students making the effort to demonstrate a healthy option by using physical activity as a way to get to school. NEPS pride themselves on promoting good health and wellbeing for all students and their families. We encourage you all to use opportunities for exercise as often as you can (it's a great way to spend time together also). Students were met by our PALS leaders who were celebrating all efforts and handing out stickers at the gates on arrival.

Well done to all and thanks to Alex and Sarah for their efforts in setting up and welcoming our students as they arrived.

# Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships.

Our school has been lucky enough have become part of this new initiative usually referred to as RRRR and yes the funding came about because the government recognises the impact of family violence on our children and communities. The reason the initiative was developed should not overshadow what it has to offer to all children in all schools.

Teachers have always acknowledged that happy confident kids make for great leaners and this initiative is based in building confidence and resilience in our children.

The lessons are set out in 8 topics taught in age appropriate activities across the whole school. Each topic addresses positive skills and behaviours to help your child as they progress through school and life.

- Emotional Literacy which develops the ability to understand, express and manage our own emotions. How often do children lose the plot and let their emotions boil over just because they can't talk about their feelings. This unit also helps children understand others. The activities in this unit can be as simple as understanding what "fair play" is.
- Personal Strengths helps children recognise and understand strengths and positive qualities in themselves and others. This can be very powerful in how your child sees themselves as a learner and is already part of the Victorian curriculum.
- Positive Coping which supports students in developing a range of coping skills, again an important life skill. Activities introduce children to positive self-talk and how to use it in challenging situations.
- Problem Solving focuses on developing thinking skills that can be used in decision making as another coping strategy.
- Stress Management something that is relevant to us all in everyday life.
   Activities in this topic focus on teaching positive approaches to stress management such as self-calming strategies.

- Help-seeking has activities designed to help children understand the importance of seeking help and providing support to friends when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone. They learn to identify trusted sources and practice seeking help.
- Gender and identity where they will learn about human rights and gender identity focusing on the importance of respect within respectful relationships. Not long ago Science and Maths were thought of as boys subjects in years 11 and 12 now more and more girls are successfully completing them to go on to exciting careers. Respecting the skills and talents of others helps children understand and develop their own.
- Positive Gender relations has age appropriate activities focusing on the skills children need to solve problems and set boundaries within relationships. How often do our children come home and say their "best friend" has told them who they can play with or something similar. They develop peer support and help seeking skills that can be applied to many situations later in life.

Some of our staff have already had the chance to have a closer look at the activities and resources and found them to user friendly, age appropriate and Australian based so as to be relevant to our culture and way of life. Lots of fun games are included and the emphasis is on building confidence and resilience in our kids.
