

#### **STEM**

Term 1 was an investigation of Earth. The year 1 and 2 students studied their environment making observations of how the landscape and sky change. An interesting observation found that the moon is often visible during the day and we learnt that the moon doesn't make it night! The level 5 and 6 students studied understanding how the solar system works by bringing together their knowledge of night & day, sun & moon rise/set and the season. They constructed their own models of the solar system and how the 1st opportunity to try out a new piece of technology – BotCars, to draw constellations.



In the last weeks of Term 1, I was fortunate to attend the Victorian Space Science Education Centre in Melbourne, to be instructed by NASA award winner Whitney Cobb. The 2 days were focused on including engineering in a science program. The possibilities are huge and like the students, I have lots to learn but look forward to experiencing the journey with them.

- Squeeze This is when you squeeze a stress ball or hold on tightly to an object. You grip hard and then slowly let go, letting go the tension at the same time.
- Glass of Water This is when you take a slow drink of water to help you gain control of yourself, your mouth and what you will say. It gives you some time to think before you say something that could be hurtful
- Time Out This is when you find a safe or quiet place to be for a while so you can calm yourself down. This might be a bench in the playground or the corner of your bedroom
