New native garden established (under the amazing direction of Mr Bill Pace) by students of Traralgon SDS, NEPS students, staff and parent volunteers. A huge thank-you to Mr Reg Poxon

Major library upgrade planned for 2019/2020 :

A huge thank-you to Mrs Janine Cruickshank and Ms Jenni Boyes who have assisted me to review our current resources. Additional thanks also goes to Ms Kathy Mewett and her fundraising team who have contributed \$5000 to this project. Mr Walsh and I have been busily applying for external grants which we also hope will further support this upgrade. The planned upgrade will involve necessary maintenance, repainting, new shelving, new signage and new furniture.

Gym maintenance and external upgrade:

following the weekend of the fete the current NEPS gym will receive a makeover. These improvements are due to support that has been made available by the Victorian School Building Authority. In addition to this, funding has also been provided by the VSBA for 2019-2020 to support further maintenance and minor works, ground works and safety measures and upgrades. One of the first projects that we are currently receiving quotes for is the replacement of our old and damaged guttering and down pipes. I will continue to update the school community of further improvements and upgrades that will be made possible via this additional funding. I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work that Kim Puddy undertakes in her role as Compliance

Officer, in order to ensure that necessary maintenance is scheduled accordingly.

Respectful Relationships Lead School – This week we received exciting news that our application for NEPS to become a Respectful Relationships lead school has been approved. I would like to extend a huge thank-you to Mr Paul Fry who prepared much of this application and who currently overseas this initiative. Paul and I will be meeting later this week to look at how we will prioritise this funding.

Planning for 2020: As term 3 draws to a close and we look to welcome in term 4 (after a much needed break), this will see us kick into some major future planning. In order to support this planning I urge all parents to ensure that they either make a time to see me in regards to any requests for their student, provide me with a letter or email detailing their request or notify the office if they are planning to transfer out. At present we have a growing number prep enrolments for 2020, therefore it is imperative that we receive the enrolment forms for any 2020 prep students who have not yet been enrolled by the start of term 4 so we can factor them into our planning.


