SWIMMING Grade 3/4's

The next grade swimming is Grade 3/4 EA Room 2. Notes were sent home yesterday.

Dear Parents, the Swimming and Water Safety Program for students in **Room 2** will commence on **Tuesday 20th April (This is the first week of Term 2)** and will continue for 8 60 minute sessions.

The cost of the program is \$45.00, which includes all entry fees and other related costs, including the cost of an additional instructor.

The Swimming & Water Safety Program is not covered by the excursion surcharge.

Parents that have successfully claimed CSEF can use it to cover the cost of swimming.

No refunds will be given unless a child misses half of the sessions due to medical reasons and a medical certificate will need to be provided.
