SWIMMIMG Grade 3/4's

The next grade swimming is Grade 3/4 EA Room 2. Notes were sent home yesterday. Dear Parents, the Swimming and Water Safety Program for students in Room 2 will commence on Tuesday 20th April (This is the first week of Term 2) and will continue for 8 60 minute sessions.

The cost of the program is \$45.00, which includes all entry fees and other related costs, including the cost of an additional instructor.

The Swimming & Water Safety Program is not covered by the excursion surcharge.

<u>Parents that have successfully claimed CSEF</u>
can use it to cover the cost of swimming.

No refunds will be given unless a child misses half of the sessions due to medical reasons and a medical certificate will need to be provided.
