SCHOOL NURSE UPDATE

The Community Outreach Nurse in Schools Program is a free service offered to students within Newborough East Primary School (NEPS). The School Nurse will be available on Tuesdays and Wednesdays to assist students and the school community with health support and linking students and caregivers to other health services. The program provides services including (but not limited to):

- Vision screening
- Hearing screening
- Linking children and families to other health services
- Supporting families to access other health services
- Dental screening

As part of support provided by the Nurse, we will document the care provided to the student and family.

This is completed through an LCHS program called TCM- which will allow you to access all services available at LCHS, eg. Dental, GP, Speech Therapy.

You can decline or opt out of having your child receive care by the School Nurse at any time. If you wish to opt out please email the School Nurse at allison.lloyd@lchs.com.au
