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A word from Mrs Skee...

In these fast and often crazy times, when life can be so busy and often chaotic KINDNESS goes a long way! At NEPS our school rules and values are all connected by RESPECT - RESPECT for SELF, RESPECT for OTHERS, RESPECT for LEARNING and RESPECT for the COMMUNITY. I strongly believe that **KINDNESS** and the way we demonstrate **RESPECT** to one another goes hand in hand. It is inevitable that we will have differences of opinion along the way, and sometimes even agree to disagree, but the way in which we interact and communicate this with one another is extremely important. I would like to remind ALL members of our AMAZING school community of our codes of conduct (not only for our students but for the adults in our learning community). As adults we model expected behaviour to our children. We should never underestimate how important our choice of behaviour is when establishing these expectations. AT NO TIME IS SWEARING, YELLING OR AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOUR ACCEPTABLE WHEN WE ARE COMMUNICATING. Unfortunately we have had a spike in such behaviour by adults in our school, and I would like to send a very clear message to ALL that this is totally unacceptable. Conversations that are deemed as aggressive (either verbal or physical) will be ended, with the aim to re convene when expected behaviours can be adhered to. Fortunately, we have a much larger number of parents and carers demonstrating more productive behaviours which of course makes our collective work supporting our children much easier. If you do have an issue, please make a time to discuss this that is mutually suitable for those it involves. It is important that we ALL work together, in a proactive (as opposed to a reactive) way to ensure that **OUR** children's time at NEPS is a **POSITIVE** one.

Lockdowns : From time to time, lockdowns are required in a school environment. These lockdowns can be for a number of reasons; a safety drill and practice of required processes, minimising danger or threat that may have been assessed or in some cases when we need to manage a behaviour with the least duress and/or effect on school operations and others. This later reason is the most common for when a lockdown is called – and the reason for our most recent lockdown on Wednesday. It is extremely important to reiterate that if any student or adult is directly at risk by school operations (such as lockdowns) the parents/carers etc will be directly notified. If your child comes home and reports that there was a lockdown, please reiterate the message that they are safe and well cared for when they are at school. I would like to thank those who contacted the school regarding this most recent lockdown and respected that aside from the administration staff reassuring them that everyone was safe, that the other details were confidential.


