GLaWAC

Fourteen of NEPS First Nations and Torres Strait Islander students, attended the GLaWAC special community open day event on the 7th of March.

Students, staff, and parent helpers travelled by bus, provided by GLaWAC to the Morwell Castle Park, for lunch and celebrations.

There were lots of free activities to do and see. Students, helpers, and staff were given free t-shirts with the five shields of the Gunaikurnai tribes.

Students were able to stamp and sign their handprints on the Southern Cross canvas which will be hung in the GLaWAC office space, symbolising, welcoming and culturally safe space for community members. Students waited patiently in the heat lining up for Mr Whippy, while watching the Boorun Boys preform a cultural dance. NEPS students who attended the day, would like to thank everyone involved behind scenes for all your extra work to get this day up and running, you are greatly appreciated. A hot fun day was had by all.

Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation (GLaWAC) is the Registered Aboriginal Party (RAP) for the Gunaikurnai, the Traditional Owners of our Country. The Gunaikurnai people are recognised by the Federal Court and the State of Victoria as the TOs of a large area of Gippsland, spanning from Warragul in the west to the Snowy River in the east, and from the Great Divide in the north to the coast in the south – approximately 10% of the Victorian state.

School Council -

School councils are groups who make decisions that set the direction of the school. They:

- help create and check the school's budget
- contribute to the school strategic plan
- make decisions on policies like investments, payments by parents, dress code.
- Councils usually have between six and 15 members, which are made up of DEET members and community members
- the principal, who is the executive officer
- parents who are chosen through an election
- a school or Department staff member

Some councils also have community members who are chosen by the council. These members have special knowledge or experience in the local community.

Further, the name, membership category, gender (optional), term of office, office held (if any) of school council members and notification whether the member is an employee of the Department will be forwarded to the Department of Education and Training by the principal by 30 April each year as a record of council membership and may be used for statistical purposes.


