The Australian Government honoured his work in 2004 by printing a 32nd Centenary, special edition of his first book 'The Monster that ate Canberra' as a Commonwealth publication ... for both residents and visitors to our Capital. Every Federal Politician received a copy! Michael was also the co-creator and designer of the 'Buddy Bear' mascot for the Alannah and Madeline Anti-Bullying Foundation (Port Arthur 1996).
